

**EKU TEACHING AND LEARNING CENTER**  
**SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES**  
**FALL SEMESTER (*through November*), 2001**

**\* TLC workshops (see attachments for details)**

Overall participation for fall semester through November = 538 (not including the 120 faculty who pre-registered to attend the Stephen Brookfield event that was cancelled due to Professor Brookfield's medical emergency). For context, the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, with a slightly larger faculty, was considered to have a high rate of participation with 800 for the entire year, including summer. About 33% of the participation comes from teaching with technology workshops and 67% yields from regular and faculty-generated workshops. So far, 18 different faculty have given workshop presentations. Regular and faculty-generated workshops are videotaped and copies are available for checkout in the Instructional Media Center on the first floor of the library. This option should increase the faculty participation rate (although specific circulation data are not currently available).

**\* New Faculty Orientation**

A two-day orientation, which included an all day bus tour of sites in EKU's service region, was facilitated by the TLC and the New Faculty Orientation Committee for all full-time regular faculty (about 60). The same two groups also put on an evening orientation for all part-time faculty. The TLC is assuming a leadership role in planning next year's new faculty orientation, which is expected to expand to include year-long TLC initiated activities.

## **\* Sponsorship of faculty conference attendance**

A campus team of 31 ECU faculty—the largest at the conference--were sent to the national Lilly conference on college teaching at Miami University (Oxford, OH) in October. Many TLC faculty-generated workshops should result spring semester.

## **\* TLC Breakfast Book Club**

In an effort to provide a variety of activities in a variety of formats, a breakfast book group was initiated. The convening builds on the ECU tradition of faculty meeting in the Faculty Club Lounge before their work day to discuss matters of general interest. So far, 22 faculty have participated, and three different faculty have served as conveners.

## **\* Teaching Consulting Process (TCP)**

The TCP continues with four TCP faculty consultants serving four ECU professors in the structured 16-week consultation process. A very successful TCP retreat generated much enthusiasm and many ideas for the program's expansion.

## **\* Individualized faculty consulting**

Videotaping and individualized consulting are offered to faculty who request it both for general issues of pedagogy as well as specific problems related to the application of technology to teaching. These services have been in demand this semester with five faculty receiving 10 general consultations and many more faculty receiving individualized teaching with technology consultations (specific data not currently available for technology consultations).

## **\* Departmental consultations**

Three departmental retreats and one departmental presentation have been provided; three consultations have been provided to department chairs.
