The EKU Alternative Spring Break (ASB) Program is designed to promote and encourage critical thinking, social action, and continued community involvement through direct service. Students who participate in ASB programs will perform purposeful service while immersing themselves in diverse environments and cultures. EKU's Alternative Spring Break program will enhance student growth and awareness through experiential learning, group discussion and individual reflection. This year EKU is offering three different ASB options. All trips are led by full-time EKU Staff members.

WHY CHOOSE ASB?

Alternative Spring Break offers an experience you won't get from a typical spring break destination and has benefits that will be carried with you long after your break is over! In addition to participating in rewarding public service, ASB students will be involved in activities that will help them develop essential skills in the areas of teambuilding, communication and leadership. ASB students are given the opportunity to explore new areas of the country, and see the impact of their work on communities. ASB is a great chance for students to meet new people, and make new friends all while having fun!

February 28th: Remaining \$100 due.

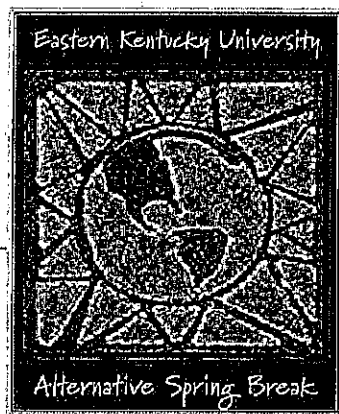
Mandatory ASB Participant Meetings

St. Louis, MO

Service: Literacy, Mentoring, Tutoring
Community Partner: AmeriCorps St. Louis

Overview: AmeriCorps St. Louis has distinguished itself as one of the leading AmeriCorps programs in the nation. The impact of AmeriCorps St. Louis on the region is profound. Each year, their organization serves in hundreds of urban St. Louis schools. Thousands of students who may otherwise fall through the cracks are given an academic foundation. Through the support of volunteer mentors and tutors, kids are given the opportunity to receive one-on-one attention that so many young people need.

Volunteers will work to attack the root cause of poverty in the St. Louis area – illiteracy. Students will have the chance to work one-on-one with elementary students as tutors, become middle school mentors, and participate in a wide-variety of after-school projects. Student volunteers will develop strong relationships with a lasting impact. There will also be opportunity for other service projects targeting poverty, hunger, conservation, etc. Students will also have an entire day to explore the city of St. Louis and enjoy some of AmeriCorps special events such as a climbing wall. Participants of this trip will be responsible for collecting children's books prior to the trip.

Biloxi, MS

Service: Youth Development, Construction, Park Restoration, Poverty, Animals, and others
Community Partner: Hands on Gulf Coast

Overview: Since Hurricane Katrina hit in August 2005, dedicated volunteers have been working hard in Biloxi to help the community pick up and start again. Volunteers from around the country have helped in everything from clearing debris to tutoring kids to beautifying parks to rebuilding homes. It's in that spirit that they continue to engage volunteers from across the nation, along side residents of the Gulf Coast in building community and rebuilding homes. Projects in the past have included removal of trees, gutting homes, walking dogs, delivering supplies, etc. Free time will include some beach time as well as a possible day-trip to New Orleans.

Jacksonville, FL

Service: Poverty, Hunger, Homelessness, Construction, Disabilities
Community Partner: Presbyterian Social Ministries, Inc.

Overview: This trip will offer an exciting experience for groups to reach out to the people of low income families and the homeless in Jacksonville. Projects will vary from day to day. Some of the assignments you will be involved with include: working soup kitchens, helping build homes, working at a food bank, working in group homes for people with disabilities, working with the Salvation Army, etc. The beach is less than 30 minutes away and Florida theme parks are 2 ½ hours away! Our free day could possibly be spent visiting Universal Studios or Disney World!

Frequently Asked Questions

The Basics

The trip leaders are:

Biloxi: Tory Allara & ???

All three trips will depart campus about 11am on Saturday, March 8

All three trips will return Saturday March 15 (probably around 10pm)

All trips will be taking 12 passenger vans

All participants should bring twin sleeping materials or sleeping bags and pillow

- (Contact Campus Recreation for information on checking out such items)

St. Louis and Jacksonville will be responsible for preparing their own food most of the time. Biloxi participants will eat at the host site most of the time.

Having Fun

Each trip will have a full free day on Sunday:

-Jacksonville will spend a day at the beach (and possibly a few afternoons...). Also will have the evenings to explore the city, and possibly St. Augustine

-Biloxi—possible day trip to explore New Orleans, and beach time

-St. Louis – free day still being planned, should have time most late afternoons/evenings to do some site seeing and other fun stuff throughout the city, climbing wall at the host site, etc.

The individual teams will be responsible for planning some of the fun events on the trip. You will have two mandatory meetings where you can work on dividing responsibilities, finalizing plans, etc.

Other cool things you might want to know

The St. Louis trip will have an AmeriCorps presentation and discussion one evening – great if you want to learn how to get up to \$9,850 to use for college

The Biloxi trip may incorporate a service-learning package that the host site is offering – this would include a tour of the city, discussion with community leaders, focused service projects, and more!

Signing up

To reserve your spot on any of the trips you must submit your ASB application and \$25 deposit

All spots are first come, first served

There is a limited amount of space available for all the trips - especially Jacksonville and St. Louis

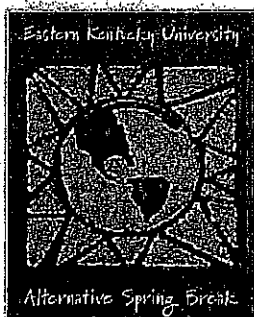
Alcohol and Drug Free Policy
