The Finance Major (BBA) offers three concentrations: Business Finance, Banking and Financial Services, and Financial Planning.

The Banking and Financial Services Concentration

The Banking and Financial Services Concentration should be selected by finance majors who wish to work in the Banking or Financial Services fields. Course work provides students a strong foundation in the understanding of financial markets, monetary policy, bank management, and how to serve consumers, businesses, and communities through the financial services industry. Courses include money and banking, financial institutions, credit analysis (includes national certificate), and bank management (including bank simulation software). This concentration gives students an understanding of monetary policy and its impact on our economy, global financial markets and the structure and operation of financial institutions.

Career Possibilities in Business Finance

Students graduating with a degree in Banking and Financial Services are employed in diverse fields such as commercial bank or financial institution management, investment banking, credit analysis, bank regulation and bank consulting.

Student Organization

Banking and Financial Services majors are encouraged to join EKU's student chapter of the Banking Risk Management Association (RMA). Student representatives from this organization are eligible for national scholarships and national networking opportunities. Student members are also eligible to sit for a Credit Analysis Certification exam prior to graduation with the opportunity to obtain a Certification along with the bachelor's degree. The RMA also provides opportunities for professional networking in the banking industry on a national level with opportunities to tour bank headquarters, the Federal Reserve, FDIC and OCC.
