Undergraduate Level Scholarships	
Byrne Memorial Education Scholarship/ Shirley	Full-time, undergraduate education majors with focus on elementary or middle grades teaching in good standing with minimum 3.0 GPA.
Call Me Mister	New or current student in good academic standing; maintain at least a 2.8 GPA; remain in good academic standing with the Call Me Mister program in the College of Education
Chastity Ross Helping Hand Scholarship	College of Education & Applied Human Sciences student with a physical disability or student with a major or minor within a field of study whose future goals are to serve children or adults with physical disabilities
College of Education Study Abroad	For full-time students in good academic standing with a 3.0 cumulative GPA and one year completed course work; first preference students from EKU service region, then Kentucky resident; preference given to student who demonstrates financial need (FAFSA required); student must be accepted to an EKU affiliated Education Study Abroad Program that applies toward their EKU degree.
Cross and Short Endowed Scholarship	Freshman or sophomore elementary education or special education/P-5 majors with 3.2 GPA or higher with preference given to first generation college students. Preference is also given to students from eastern Kentucky with special preference for students from Pulaski County. This is a renewable scholarship.
DeHoop Scholarship Fund/Wieste	Awarded to an undergraduate student pursuing a degree in the field of Special Education with demonstration of strong scholarship, service to the profession and community, with leadership potential. Applicant must be nominated by a member of the Eastern Kentucky University community.
Faye Allen Hale Non-Endowed Scholarship	Full time undergrads in Junior or Senior year majoring in education to pursue a career in elementary or high school teacher; U.S. Citizen from Eastern KY; 2.5 min. GPA
Francis Scholarship Fund	For a senior elementary education major with a language arts emphasis who shows "demonstrated quality of effort and performance in class, lab, & academic studies" plus faculty recommendations.
Gifford Endowed Scholarship	Full-time elementary or secondary education major who is a Kentucky resident having graduated from a Kentucky high school. Must have financial need. This scholarship is renewable.
Hansen Memorial Fund/Mae	Junior or senior standing student admitted to Professional Education Program. Student must have financial need and show evidence of positive personal qualities and high academic achievement.
Jennings & Stratemeyer Scholarship	Awarded to one sophomore male and one sophomore female who are members of Kappa Delta Pi, the education honor society.
J. Dorland and Thomas Jackson Coates Scholarship	Kentucky resident majoring in education, having above average academic potential and personal traits of good citizenship. Preference will be given to students with financial need. This is a renewable scholarship. (High school seniors are eligible to apply.)
Keen Scholarship/Quentin and Mary Ann	Full-time education major with a focus in one or more of the Sciences. Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
Marie Celine Braun Kuhl Non-Endowed Scholarship	For full time undergrads in Junior or Senior year majoring in education to pursue a career in elementary or high school teacher; U.S. Citizen from Eastern KY; 2.5 min. GPA
McKinney Scholarship for Elementary Teachers	For elementary education majors from southern Madison County, Kentucky
Miller Award Fund/Nancy	Awarded annually to two graduating elementary education majors (K-4, 5-8). One recipient should be an on-campus resident and one recipient an off-campus resident who lives at home. Nominees should be graduating seniors "whose conduct through their enrollment at EKU has given evidence of outstanding humanistic and Christian characteristics. The recipients are (to be) individuals whose love for and desire to serve mankind and whose vibrancy, industriousness, and positive attitude have won the respect of faculty and fellow students." While the student is expected to have a good academic record, outstanding academic performance is not a criterion for selection or recipients of this award.
Pigman Memorial Endowed Scholarship Fund	Full-time female elementary education major from Eastern Kentucky with preference given to residents of Floyd or Knott Counties first. This is a renewable scholarship.

Ramsey Endowed Scholarship Fund/Imogene	Elementary or middle school education majors who have completed 60 hours with at least a 2.75 GPA, for students from EKU's 22-county service region with preference given to first-generation college students with financial need. This is a renewable scholarship.
Stubbs Boord Endowed Scholarship/ Sallie	For full time rising freshman, sophomore, junior or senior in College of Education; minimum 2.5 GPA; demonstrate financial need; preference toward a first generation student
Wilburn & Wilburn Endowed Scholarship/ Robert & Gabriele	Full-time student, Kentucky resident with preference for students in the following counties: Clay, Jackson, Knox, Perry, Leslie, and Letcher, if none, then preference to students from EKU service region; maintain a 2.8 cumulative GPA; elementary education , middle education, high school and all grades education, education for the deaf and hard of hearing; and learning or behavior disorders; rising freshman, sophomore; junior, or senior and demonstrate financial need
Williamson Endowed Scholarship/ John	Pursuing a degree in English; displaying a background in the creative and/or performing arts (preferable); maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA

Martin Endowed Graduate Education Scholarship/Joe David and Alice	Graduate students pursuing Master's or Doctoral degree in Education. Preference given to current full-time elementary or secondary teachers. Must have financial need. Renewable if minimum 3.25 GPA is maintained.
McGuffey Scholarship Endowment for the Teaching of Mathematics	Full-time graduate student pursuing a Master's degree in math education. Applicant/recipient must have been born in Kentucky, with a preference given to residents of Clinton, Wayne, Cumberland, or Russell Counties first.
Pam Powell Endowed Scholarship Fund for Graduate Students in Education	Graduate students pursuing advanced degree in Curriculum and Instruction. Preference is given to students who are teaching in Madison County.

Equity and Inclusion Excellence Scholarship	For students that are U.S. citizens and residents of Kentucky; maintain at least a 2.5 GPA; declare teacher education as a major field of study; undergraduate or graduate student pursuing initial teacher certification; maintain continuous full time enrollment or be part-time within 18 semester hours of receiving teacher education degree
Skepple Family Endowed Scholarship	COE graduate or at least second year student who intends to teach P/K-12th grade with preferences given to first generation college students, underrepresented populations, and who show academic promise and financial need.
Thompson Lutes Memorial Scholarship/ Stella	Sophomores, juniors, and seniors or graduate student, KY resident, majors in College of Education, 3.0 GPA, renewable
William and Juanita Dick Endowed Scholarship	Full time undergraduate sophomore, junior, or senior or part-time graduate student; majoring in Education or Special Education Minimum 3.0 GPA

Alderton Memorial Endowment	Full- or part-time male graduate student working on a Master's degree in Mental Health Counseling
Coates Fund	Kentucky resident majoring in education, having above average academic potential and personal traits of good citizenship. Preference will be given to students with financial need. This is a renewable scholarship. (High school seniors are eligible to apply.)
Cooper Memorial Fund	Graduate student in the College of Education, 3.6 GPA minimum
Cross and Short Endowed Scholarship	Freshman or sophomore elementary education or special education/P-5 majors with 3.2 GPA or higher with preference given to first generation college students. Preference is also given to students from eastern Kentucky with special preference for students from Pulaski County. This is a renewable scholarship.
DeHoop Scholarship Fund/Wieste	Awarded to an undergraduate student pursuing a degree in the field of Special Education with demonstration of strong scholarship, service to the profession and community, with leadership potential. Applicant must be nominated by a member of the Eastern Kentucky University community.
Franz-Myers Scholarship	Students working on a Master's degree in Library Science, renewable for up to two years with a 3.0 GPA
Gifford Endowed Scholarship	Full-time elementary or secondary education major who is a Kentucky resident having graduated from a Kentucky high school. Must have financial need. This scholarship is renewable.
Hansen Memorial Fund/Mae	Junior or senior standing student admitted to Professional Education Program. Student must have financial need and show evidence of positive personal qualities and high academic achievement.
Harris Scholarship Fund	For special education majors with a communications disorder emphasis.
Jennings & Stratemeyer Scholarship	Awarded to one sophomore male and one sophomore female who are members of Kappa Delta Pi, the education honor society.
Keen Scholarship/Quentin and Mary Ann	Full-time education major with a focus in one or more of the Sciences. Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA
Lutes Memorial Endowed Scholarship	Undergraduate or graduate student who is a Kentucky resident and completed freshman year at EKU majoring in education, have at least a 3.0 GPA, have qualities of good character, leadership, citizenship, promise of high academic achievement and commitment of service to others. This is a renewable scholarship.
Martin Endowed Graduate Education Scholarship/Joe David and Alice	Graduate students pursuing Master's or Doctoral degree in Education. Preference given to current full-time elementary or secondary teachers. Must have financial need. Renewable if minimum 3.25 GPA is maintained.
McGuffey Scholarship Endowment for the Teaching of Mathematics	Full-time graduate student pursuing a Master's degree in math education. Applicant/recipient must have been born in Kentucky, with a preference given to residents of Clinton, Wayne, Cumberland, or Russell Counties first.
McKinney Scholarship for Elementary Teachers	For elementary education majors from southern Madison County, Kentucky
Miller Award Fund/Nancy	Awarded annually to two graduating elementary education majors (K-4, 5-8). One recipient should be an on-campus resident and one recipient an off-campus resident who lives at home. Nominees should be graduating seniors "whose conduct through their enrollment at EKU has given evidence of outstanding humanistic and Christian characteristics. The recipients are (to be) individuals whose love for and desire to serve mankind and whose vibrancy, industriousness, and positive attitude have won the respect of faculty and fellow students." While the student is expected to have a good academic record, outstanding academic performance is not a criterion for selection or recipients of this award.
Pam Powell Endowed Scholarship Fund for Graduate Students in Education	Graduate students pursuing advanced degree in Curriculum and Instruction. Preference is given to students who are teaching in Madison County.
