During your first honors advising appointment (in October/November), you'll discuss your personal and career goals with your honors advisor to lay out your remaining honors path, which will include the following:

## Honors Electives (3-6 hours):

Honors electives are 300-level honors seminars that count toward general education credits you still need to take. Your honors advisor will help you choose which classes are best for you. Our slate of 300-level seminars changes every semester, so there's always something new and exciting to take. Check out the next page for some examples.

## Honors Experiences (1-2 experiences, 0-6 hours):

Honors experiences can be completed by taking additional Honors Elective courses, completing Honors Enhancements, or a combination of the two.

Honors Enhancements are pre-approved experiences that are documented in your Honors Portfolio. These might include a study abroad or significant study away experience, a significant co-op or internship, or a significant, faculty-mentored undergraduate research experience. You will learn more about your options for Honors Enhancements and how to document them in your Honors Portfolio in HON 100.

## Honors Thesis (6 hours):

Your honors thesis is a year-long research experience on the topic of your choice. You'll work one-on-one with a faculty mentor over two semesters to create a thesis project you can be proud of and that will make you stand out in your future professional or career goals.
