

New First-Year Honors Students at Summer Orientation

Required courses in fall semester:

HON 100: Engaging in Honors (1 credit hour)

HON 101: The Examined Life (3 credit hours)

- HON 100 no longer counts as a student success seminar. Honors students will need to take their college-specific seminar or GSD 101.
- HON 101 counts as an Element 3B: Humanities course. Honors students must take HON 101 even if they already have credit for Element 3B.
- Honors students will need Elements 1A, 1B, and 1C if they do not already have prior credit. They will not get these credits through the honors program.
- HON 100 and HON 101 are linked – specific HON 100 sections are matched with specific HON 101 sections so that students have class with the same peers 4 days a week.
 - These cannot be linked in CourseLeaf, so they must be registered using the matched CRNs (once available).
 - Katie will check these throughout the summer to make sure they're correct.
